The Bluebird Trail

Our bird team stayed busy during 2019. We put up a total of 55 nest boxes, a few of which were installed across Pughtown Road in the upper fields. One box is located at the home of Dr. Jean Flood and is our only off-campus location. Dr. Flood's nest box produced ten new Eastern bluebirds in each of the last two years, which is an excellent number.

The 2019 nesting season was difficult for our Eastern bluebirds. Many pairs were evicted from their nests by tree swallows and house wrens. Only 98 new bluebirds made it out of the Village's nest boxes. To "fledge" means that baby birds grew strong enough to fly out of nest boxes under their own wing power. Two years ago, our nest boxes fledged 122 new bluebirds, and last year (in 2018) they fledged 106 new bluebirds.

We faced a few challenges during the year. The Eastern bluebirds built 43 nests and laid a total of 150 blue eggs. Because bluebirds need their nest boxes out in the open – in their search for insects - they are vulnerable to predators. A total of 52 bluebird eggs did not produce new birds. Egg failures were caused by takeovers of the nest box by other birds, ant infestations, and occasional human errors.

We lost five bluebird nests due to actions of house wrens – those cute little brown birds with a happy song. When wrens find eggs of other birds inside nest boxes, they pierce them with their needle-like beaks. This kills those eggs that are usually bluebird eggs. We have an abundance of house wrens in the Village. There were so many wrens in the Vineyard that we had to take down every nestbox there, because all bluebirds had been driven away. Tree swallows also evict bluebirds from their nests.

We put some bluebird boxes close to roadways in order to monitor them more closely. On a couple of occasions, a nestbox was destroyed by a vehicle – accidental contact. From April through July these roadside boxes may have baby birds in them, so we need to be vigilant while driving.

Bird team members include: Bill Lewis, Charlene Roth, Allen Alexion, Michael Weinstein, and others. Many Villagers have helped us over the 15 years we've run the "Bluebird Trail" under the guidance of John Tower and myself. In 2019, we undertook a new project - installing a Purple Martin House along Camphill Drive. We hope this "condo" of nesting chambers will attract Purple Martins in 2020. We struggled to keep out starlings during the year. As a tribute to CVKH, I purchased and donated this top-of-the-line Purple Martin House.

We thank everyone at the Camphill Community for their support and helpfulness! We enjoy our conversations and interactions. Talking about birds is educational and enjoyable. The Bird Team is eager to put up nest boxes for the 2020 season, which will begin in March!


Thank You to Our Generous Donors in 2019





COVID-19 Coronavirus


2019 Operating Expenses \$2,407,785


I felt an immediate connection to the community and was refreshed and inspired by the practicality of daily life in the village; cooking meals using vegetables from the garden that I had helped grow, and crafting bowls and mugs in the pottery with the thought of using them to serve these meals in, and all done alongside people who taught me much about patience, joy and creativity. These created in me a sense of purpose that I had not experienced before.

Years later, this sense of awe and meaning has not worn off but has become integrated into the fabric of my being. I feel it when doing tasks that may seem mundane on the surface but have become imbued with a higher purpose, particularly when done with others, whether that be wiping the table after meals, chopping carrots, or mulching under grapevines. There do come times, however, when life can feel less than idyllic - moments of frustration or overwhelm do happen here, but with the support of each other we find our footing again, and strive to use those moments to spark growth or learning from the experience.

Since that first year, I've deepened my relationship and commitment to the community, experienced living and homemaking in several houses, taken on new roles and spent many hours tending the orchards and vineyard. My fiance, Eli Maltz, and I are happily settled in the newly renovated Kerria House, along with our friends Charlene, Noah, Sebastian, Lauren and Lynn. As ever, we are grateful to have such a beautiful place to live, with good friends to share meals and laughter with, and a warm and supportive community surrounding us. We look forward to the coming years.
